Dr Aloo: My experience with the group was blissful. I got a lot of help from Jedidah and Ben and the in charge of the local clinic, Mr Owen. I found the event to have been well organised such that the patients had an easy time, didn't have to queue for long and the test results requested didn't take long either.

Patient turnout was relatively fine in relation to the catchment population. Most of the patients were elderly, with chronic illnesses and were afraid to seek medical help because of issues like cost and the distances they had to cover to reach the hospitals as they were alone. We were able to help with the medications that we had and advice accordingly. We had patients we were diagnosing hypertension for the first time, and I was glad because they will not have to come to the hospital when they have already complicated lives as is always the case.

Jeremy Rensford: It was great to spend a morning with the AIDex students that are now all grown up and in tertiary education. Some of them had travelled up to half a day in overnight buses to be there. Such commitment. It was great to see the richness of fellowship between these older students; they clearly enjoyed this opportunity to renew acquaintances and tell yarns to each other of campus life. It was a vivid reminder to me of the importance of AIDex's partnering with these young people from the commencement of primary school all the way through to completion of high school and even into university years. The AIDex motto of "love God, help others" rang true as several of these older students reporting back to me their strong desire to go back and make a difference in communities as educated adults. I was also impressed with some of them being so clear in their proclamation of their love for Jesus and desire to serve him. Some of them clearly had real leadership gifting and I can see these young people are the calibre of godly human beings that can help turn the great country of Kenya around.

A worthy investment indeed, for those who are contributing to AIDex, thanks so much – it makes a difference and to those that will in the future – thank you! What a blessing these young people were.

Deenie: The widows' ministry went well especially with the expert assistance of Erina who is a fantastic liaising person, helping to connect in so many ways. I would estimate the number of widows as over one hundred in the two locations. As usual, we had clothes to distribute as well as Bibles. This year we also had the added bonus of reading glasses. Most of the widows could demonstrate their ability to read and were so excited to be see the words clearly. We were blessed to have enough to give the glasses to everyone in need of them. The women in Sioport were given cards of encouragement by women from the Williams' church in Sydney. I had a few leftovers which I gave to one of the women's prayer groups. In Busia we had enough of the hygiene products left to give to widows under 50. In both areas I shared from the scriptures how the great Apostle Paul learned to be content in all circumstances by depending on God's presence and His grace. In Busia, about 8 people responded to a call to become Christians. I doubt all of them were first time decisions, but they were encouraged to be in fellowship and discipled. They were referred to local churches. In both locations we prayed with the widows for the Lord's protection and provision. It was great to catch up with several widows that I have become familiar with over my four visits. I had a fantastic time with the people involved in the worship ministry – probably up to 120 or more in the two locations. The main thing I hope was left with them is that worship is a lifestyle and worship in the context of the local church should include Body ministry which depends on giving room for the Holy Spirit to speak. At the second conference, there was an immediate positive response. Those involved with the volume of sound began to actually understand that if the focus is inside, not outside, the volume can be turned down. I noticed that sometimes the music is in a different key to the voices and encouraged the musicians to either set the key ahead of time, or if the key is not easily found, just to sing unaccompanied. All this leads to a greater sense of the presence of the Lord and His anointing. We had some good times of worship after our sessions. Erina and I encouraged different leaders to take part in leading the rest of us. Kenya is an incredible place to visit, as it gives a much broader understanding and appreciation of how others live who have not the same resources and opportunities as we. It is perhaps therefore not surprising that they have such an openness to the Gospel and the hunger amongst Christians for more of the Lord and his teaching is so encouraging. We have many ongoing opportunities of sharing in ever increasing areas – with health being one of the most recent. For those with a sense of adventure and a desire to share the Gospel and impact the lives of others (and indeed, be impacted yourself), I can highly recommend a missions trip to Kenya.
